- All still exhibit and performing arts exhibitors are required to serve 2 hours
 of either security detail, pre fair setup or assist the department during fair.
 An email with opportunities to help will be sent to exhibitors prior to fair.
- The community booth is for independent exhibitors or smaller clubs. It is the responsibility of those exhibitors to set up, display and maintain their projects in the community booth.
- Proper dress code must be followed in the sale ring. See dress code in the Board Policies portion of the fairbook.
- Due date for creative literary arts, videography, and youth business will be the 2nd Friday of July.

- Exhibits entered in classes 62002 through 62004 are eligible to be exhibited in the Modeling Class 60095 in Performing Arts.

Feeder Calf Sale


- Dairy Feeder calves will not be individually sold in the live auction.
- Exhibitors selling their dairy feeder calves will be paid a guaranteed market floor price.
- All dairy feeder calves sold will be listed on a bid board the week of fair and offered for the buyers to directly purchase for a higher individual floor price.
- The Dairy Market Department will collectively solicit funds to go towards each dairy feeder calf pound sold. This will include introducing all dairy feeder exhibitors and a callout to bidders during the live auction.
- Exhibitors are encouraged to connect with potential supporters to increase their market price via multiple bonus bids on their dairy feeder project.

Beef | Jenna Young & Josh Beukema

- DNA hair samples will be collected by the superintendent, or someone approved by the superintendent, by Jan 1st of the current fair year. Collection will be in November or the Friday and Saturday at the Michigan Winter Classic preceding year of fair.
- A Maintainer Breed class has been added to both the breed and market show.
- Ultrasound and check in will begin at 10am Sunday. We will start at one end
 of the barn and work to the other end.
- Tie-outs areas will be assigned.
- Finished Market Steers and finished Market Heifers must be born on or after January 1st of the previous fair year. This rule will take effect for the 2026 fair year.

Sheep | Kara Schut & Kendra Lloyd

- Breeders flock/club flock change: 4 animals required can be one aged ewe or yearling ewe, two ewe lambs and one ram lamb.
- Ewe lambs can be shown in both market and breeding classes but MUST be entered in both classes by entry deadline.
- Scrapie tags Place scrapie tag number beginning with state abbreviations in the Scrapie Flock ID portion in Fairentry.
- The lamb identifier number found on front and back of tag, enter in the identifier and tag you **Identifier Tag** number in Fairentry.





Goat Autumn Beukema & Paige VanderWay

- No does shall be brought to fair who are due to kid within a month of the fair.
- Bred & Owned Class: Please read fairbook rules carefully.
- Showmanship: Exhibitors may show both dairy and market goat showmanship.
- Goat Education: New options to replace our record book.
 - Superintendent Approved Educational Event
 - Market Goat Expense Book
 - Breeding & Exhibition Goat Education Poster
 - Educational Contest (Online quiz for each age division with general goat show and health questions with age group prizes.)
- Saturday goat check accommodations will be made upon request.
 - Weigh in will remain on Sunday following Sheep weigh in.

Swine - Heather Everett

- Swine show will be a market breed show with Borrow and Gilts shown together and a Market Cross show with borrows shown separate from Gilts.
- Superintendent will make class corrections at the scale or prior to check in.
- Smaller breed classes may be combined into an AOB class.
- All hogs will be declared with the 840 or NUES# by June 15th prior to fair.
 If available, you must add ear notches. Please take good Photos.
- Market Breed classes are as follows: Berkshire, Chester White, Duroc, Hampshire, Hereford, Landrace, Poland China, Spot, Tamworth, and Yorkshire.
- Market Cross hogs will be judged in two classes: Barrow and Gilt.

Poultry | Mary Crosby & Shelly Johnson

 Minimum weight of market birds has been changed to a minimum of 4 ½ lbs each.

- All market pens must be determined and tagged per exhibitor prior to check in. Switching birds between family members will not be permitted.
- There are bantam duck classes separate from standard size ducks this year so look in Fairentry for those changes.

 The rule "Communication with the animal handler is prohibited." has been removed.

Fairentry

- Exhibitor families must submit their own Fairentry.
 Club leaders may no longer submit entries for their members.
- **Club Entries:** There will be no entry fees charged for clubs and no premiums paid out to clubs.

Collect all your information before you start.

Make a list of your classes, animals,
appropriate tag information,
good photos of your hogs,
copy of your insurance for atv/golf cart,

RFID tag - Do not leave spaces in your RFID number.

Membership

- Membership can be purchased through Fairentry for \$20.
- Benefits: Members receive one complimentary parking pass for the following year.
 - Fairweek camping is at a reduced rate of \$100. for the following year's fair.
 - Reduced rate on rentals.
 - Voting rights at the annual meeting the first Wednesday of November.

Camping & Parking

Camping: Exhibitor family - \$120.00
 Members -\$100.00

- Parking: \$20.00 for a weekly pass, \$10.00 daily.
- Golf Cart/ATV: \$30.00 remember to have your insurance ready to upload when you go into Fairentry.

Camping Safety

- Make sure your Lot # is visible from the road.
- Place your generator at least 5 feet from your camper with the exhaust facing out and good ventilation. Do not place anything under it.
- Place gas cans at least 5 feet away from your generator and not by exhaust.
